"Four years of study, woo, I hadn't really studied anything in about 45 years, would I be up to this? I am here tonight to say that yes I was able, and yes I learnt. I certainly learnt about theology, history, the Bible, new words, about myself and about others.

EFM has been a most valuable resource, the four years flew by and I miss those times. I miss the group, I miss my friends. And I have a feeling of what is next? Is there something coming – I don't know, but if something, presents itself and is as accommodating, as worthwhile as EFM has been for me, I will certainly pick it up and continue on the path of exploration and intention that EFM started for me."

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From the Chair.....



I was fortunate to spend seven days in February on retreat – seven days that stretched out ahead of me with glorious simplicity, the promise of rest, and the potential for some deep “God-connection”. There was lots of rest, there was a sense of simplicity, and there was plenty of God-connection. But in another sense, there was much to be done, as I found myself immersed deeply in personal theological reflection, fruitfully using this gift of time and space to take stock, reflect and process what for me had been a year of challenge, change and transition.

One of the blessings of the new EFM curriculum is that it intentionally frames theological reflection not only as something that EFM groups “do” when they meet, but also as an individual life skill. In the words of Volume A (Week 8) of the Reading and Reflection Guide, “Theological reflection is a life skill used to create meaning, in fact, to discover ultimate meaning. What makes reflection theological is not a specialized vocabulary, but the relentless, restless urge to experience wholeness which brings a person to the Holy.” As a group process, theological reflection encourages sharing, exploring and wondering together. As an individual process, theological reflection can help us find meaning in personal events or challenges that may seem to make no sense. In whatever setting, the process of theological reflection encourages dialogue between scripture/church tradition, the world in which we live, our own experiences/actions, and our personal attitudes and positions. We draw on God’s never-ending story and discover where it meets ours.

The art of theological reflection is learned through practice. There is no one “best” way, and some methods or experiences of theological reflection will “work” or resonate more deeply with us than others. I pray that you will be open to the fruits it offers, give thanks to God when it reveals fresh insight, persevere if it seems “too hard”, and revel in the spirit of inquiry that is at the heart of EFM.

May God bless your EFM journey.

The amount of reading and/or preparation is

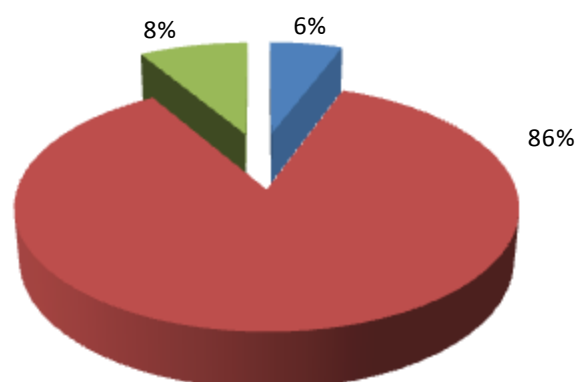
-  Too little required

-  Too difficult to understand



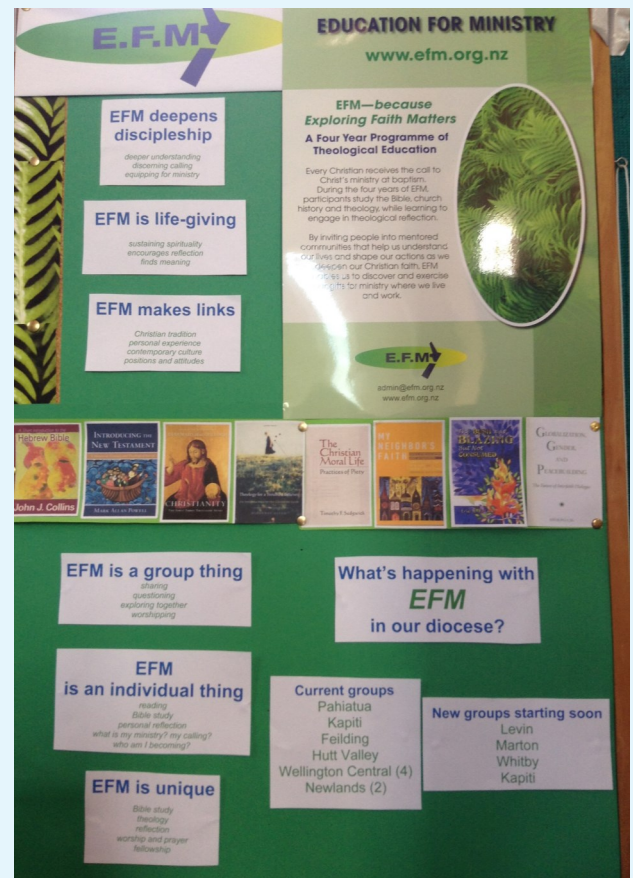
Comments copied from the a selection of survey responses.....

- The RRG is much easier to use than previous material - a huge improvement
- The RRG helps me to link what I read to society and life I am living in. It really helps me to reflect on what I really believe in and whether or not this is being acted out in my life.
- We always seem to have such interesting discussions that the evening is gone before we know it!
- In the beginning the theoretical reflection (TR) was difficult to grasp. Now I enjoy where the Holy Spirit takes me. I sometimes struggle but I find myself wanting to finish TR.
- I consider this years reading was too great for me. Perhaps I never allow enough time for it.
- I found the interlude book "And God Spoke" really helpful, but I'm conscious that not everyone agrees.
- I am enjoying the group and the theological reflections have helped me to refocus & refine my faith.
- It is giving me a lot of confidence academically in my faith, and the confidence to start preaching in our "local shared ministry" model of church.
- Large amount of material - but it's good material.
- Mostly it is good - sometimes a challenge to absorb the quantity of data in the time available.
- Having a two year grand tour of the Bible is good.
- Very interesting. Relieved and reassured to learn amount the origins & times of the biblical context. How & why things came to be recorded.
- It has made me more aware of the basis of my faith, opening up deeper thought and understanding - my prayer time is now No 1 priority.
- We're drawing some real insight from the texts, combined with each other's reading and experience.

The wonderful new EFM banners drew lots of attention at the Wellington Anglican Diocesan Hui on 7 March, at Wellington Cathedral of St Paul.

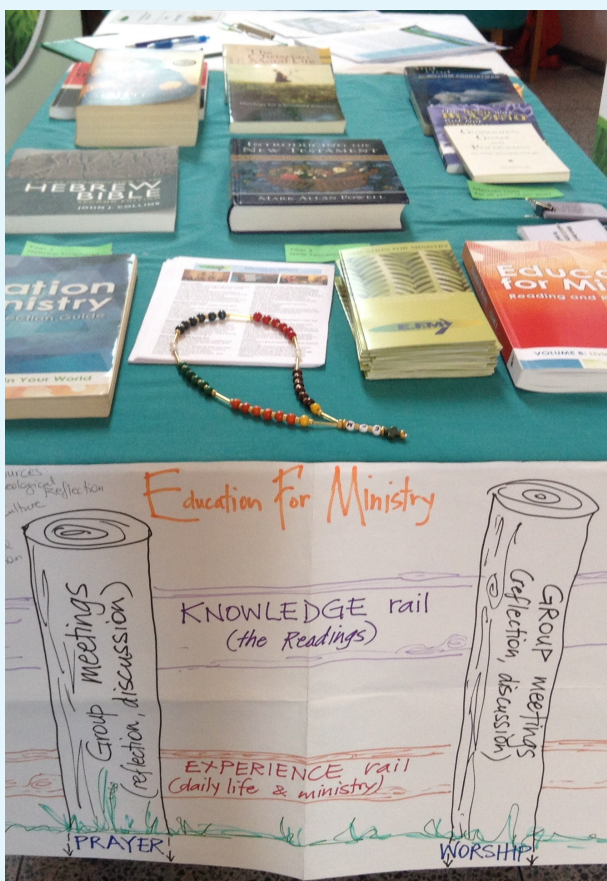
It was a great occasion when about 480 people from all over the diocese gathered together to hear speakers on the issues of child poverty, discipleship and biculturalism, to worship together, and to browse the "marketplace" in the nave of the Cathedral set up with many stalls and displays.

As one of the discipleship models promoted in the diocese, the EFM stall attracted lots of attention as people flicked through the new EFM text books and added their thoughts to the big Theological Reflection sheets....

An image of a lone polar bear on a floating remnant of an ice cap invited responses to the following questions:

- ⇒ What in the media, in our society, in the culture and time we live in does this picture evoke in you?
- ⇒ What in the Bible and our church tradition does this picture make you think of?
- ⇒ What opinions, perspectives, and personal positions does this picture evoke in you?
- ⇒ What does this picture make you want to do?

Lots of people added their thoughts - they were doing TR without even realising it!
