



## New curriculum underway

Groups around New Zealand began using the new EFM curriculum in February.

The first boxes of the newly printed *Reading and Reflection Guides Volume A* (RRG) were posted out to groups in February. So far there are nine groups around the country using the new material. Some of

Groups in USA gave feedback in November last year on the new texts. Information from the nearly 1,000 EFM groups in USA was collated, and the responses are summarised in the graphs on pages 3-4.

these are multi-level groups; others are single level groups.

The new material presents fresh challenges for mentors and group members as everyone becomes familiar with the new format and text books, but initial feedback is positive.

Comments include:

*The new RRG is well presented and easy to follow*

*Each year's reading is clearly spelt out*

*The new text books, especially the beautiful Year 2 text book, are very readable*

*I love the online resources and links*

There will be opportunities for trainers, mentors and groups to offer detailed feedback as they work their way through the new material this year.

### *From the Interim Executive Officer...*

*It's great to see the positive response to the new EFM curriculum in New Zealand. The Board took a bit of a 'leap of faith' last year when it decided to introduce it from 2014, but the signs are that EFM's fresh new look is already bearing much fruit.*

*So far this year, 22 new Year 1 participants have signed up for EFM, joining either new or existing groups. That's not far off the total number of new Year 1 participants for the whole of 2013. More new groups are highly likely to start within the next few months in Auckland, Pahiatua, Feilding, Taranaki, and Dunedin. Our first print run of the RRG Volume A was 100—but it's probable we will need a further print run to cater for the demand.*

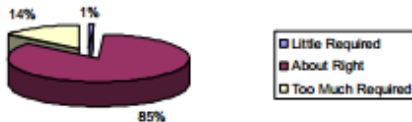

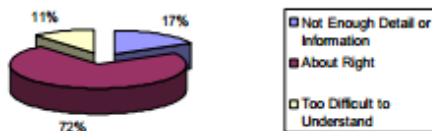
## YEAR ONE

"Text gives many new insights."

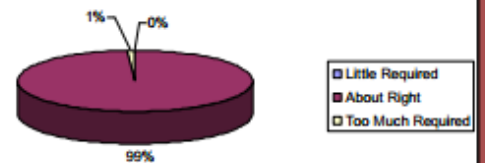
For Year One: What is your response to the textbook assigned?

"The Texts are fantastic! So much better than anything we've had before!"

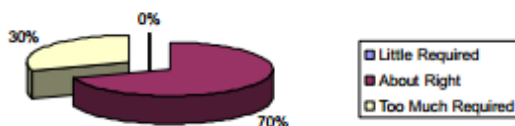
For Year Two: What is your response to the textbook assigned?



"Text is Awesome...wide range of learning depth and ability."

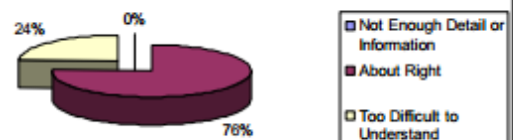
## YEAR THREE

For Year Three: What is your response to the amount of reading and/or preparation assigned?



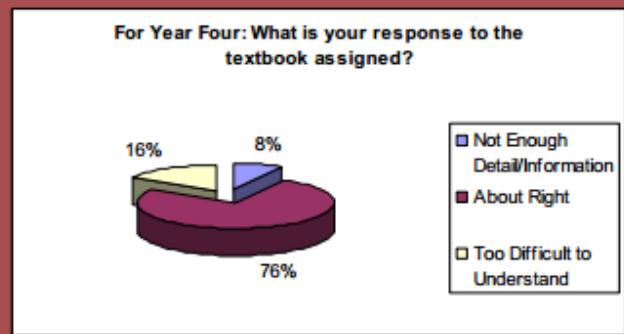
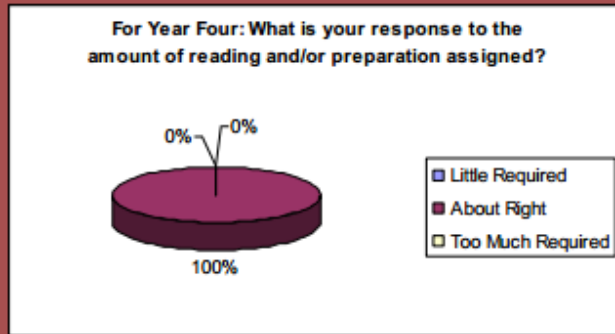

## FAQ - New Curriculum

### Who uses the new Reading and Reflection Guide (RRG)?

All EFM group members using the new curriculum at the moment use Volume A of the RRG, whatever year of study they are in. The RRG follows a four-year cycle of its own, and is being rolled out year by year. USA will begin to use Volume B in their 2014/2015 academic year (beginning later in 2014). In NZ, groups will begin to use Volume B from February 2015.

### How do the volumes of the RRG differ from each other?

Each RRG has a theme. Volume A focuses on "Living Faithfully in Your World", and the reflection questions and activities in the RRG reflect that theme. The theme of Volume B will be "Living Faithfully in a Multi-cultural World". So, although the text book reading for each year of study may remain the same across different volumes of the RRG, the reflection questions that guide members through their year of study will differ. The "interlude books" (additional books that every group member reads regardless of their year of study) also change according to the theme of the RRG.

### What about the NZ component of EFM?

The NZ component of EFM (focusing on Allan Davidson's book *Christianity in Aotearoa*) fits most logically into Year 3 of the new EFM curriculum, which covers church history. Mentors of Year 3 groups using the new curriculum this year have the flexibility to decide when and how they cover the NZ material (eg by slotting it in, or adding it to the end of Year 3). We will seek feedback on how they get on. In addition, EFM trainers are likely to focus on this issue in their training this year, including the possibility of updated reading guides and identifying other NZ resources to accompany EFM's use of *Christianity in Aotearoa*.

- *The Bush Was Blazing but not Consumed* by Eric Law
- *Globalization, Gender, and Peacebuilding: The Future of Interfaith Dialogue* by Kwok Pui-lan.

Both these books fit the year's focus on being a faithful Christian ministering in an intercultural and increasingly non-Christian context.
